**Dr. Abigail Schlesinger** is a child and adolescent psychiatrist with an interest in increasing access to quality behavioral health and developmental services for children and families. She was instrumental in the development of the Children's Community Pediatrics Behavioral Health (CCPBH), a service that embeds therapist and psychiatrist in pediatric primary care. CCCBH has won local, state, and national awards for efficiently improving access to care.

Dr. Schlesinger has also been recognized for her own clinical and academic expertise as Physician of the Year at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic (WPIC) in 2013. She also formerly served as the training director of the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Triple Board Programs at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh and Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic). She is currently leading the integration of developmental, behavioral, and community resources for Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, and has been appointed as the Medical Director for TiPS (Children's Telephonic Psychiatric Consultation Service), and Medial Director of Ambulatory Integrated Behavioral Health for WPIC.

Kate Swenson is the creator of Finding Cooper's Voice, an online and in-person community, where families of children with disabilities can come together to celebrate, laugh, cry, learn and get support. With over a million followers her goal is to normalize the stigmas surrounding having a member of the family with a disability and what she refers to as a 'secret world'. Her book, Forever Boy, A Mother's Memoir of Autism and Finding Joy was published in 2022 and quickly became a national bestseller. Kate, her husband, and four kids, live in Minnesota.
